The Turkey River Recreational Corridor (TRRC) Board has been working throughout the year "to connect Clermont, Elgin and Elkader to develop and enhance the existing natural resource base through the creation of land and water trails to serve as the catalyst for economic growth and development." - Submission of Iowa Great Places Grant for Motor Mill Inn project

- Attendance and promotion at the Iowa State Fair and Canoecopia
- Promotion of the Turkey River Recreational Corridor during RAGBRAI

- Support of Clayton County Conservation's Attracting Success project and summit

Attended a citizen-led Elkader project planning meeting on January 27, 2022 and follow-up with potential funding sources and support for identified projects and priorities.

Assisted the City of Elgin with RAGBRAI funding applications to Alliant Energy, Aureon, and Viafield.

Participated in various webinars and workshops to identify potential funding sources for TRRC and TRRC partner projects and initiatives.


Represented the TRRC in partnership with the Northeast Iowa Tourism Association at the Iowa State Fair.

Turkey River Safari

The 2022 Turkey River Safari saw participation from approximately 500 individuals, most of which reside in the northeast Iowa region. Planning, preparation, and facilitation of the safari program requires multiple steps and various levels of coordination. The Safari, in it's 11th year was considered a success and will continue with local partner and business support.

Total Raised for TRRC Sponsorships: \$4,325.00

Attracting Success

Other program support in 2022 included partnership with the Clayton County Conservation Board to support the Attracting Success initiative. Clayton County and Northeast Iowa is already home to many young professionals and entrepreneurs that are starting businesses and building legacies. These individuals stayed or moved here for a reason. The goal of Attracting Success was to share their stories through videos (YouTube) and use that to continue to attract individuals to our beautiful corner of the state. The summit on September 23, 2022 in Volga brought current and potential leaders together to talk about rural Northeast Iowa, student-driven potential, leadership opportunities, and other efforts currently in the works to enhance and promote all that Clayton County has to offer.

*City Councils appoint their TRRC board representatives annually. County Supervisors appoint their TRRC board representatives every 2 years. At large members are appointed every 3 years.

Board members met monthly to receive updates from the TRRC Director and to make decisions about funding priorities, programming, advertising, and partner support. Current representatives are included below. The TRRC Director also participates in other partner meetings including Northeast Iowa Tourism Association, River Bluffs Scenic Byway, and RPA 1 Enhancement Committee. In additional to these partner meetings, the TRRC Director sits on the Iowa Rivers Revival Advisory Board (3-year term).




.06 *Trail Counting & Economic Study*

Deliverables

- 1. Coordinate volunteers to conduct an in-person trail count and survey in the summer (July 2022)
- 2. Partner with Northeast Iowa counties to compile trail count data
- 3. Manage and maintain infrared trail counters in the TRRC (4 counters owned by the TRRC, 1 counter owned by FCCB, 2 counters owned by CCCB, 1 counter owned by UERPC 8 Total)

In person trail counts took place July 8-9 in Fayette County and July 15-16 in Clayton County. A total of eight infrared TRAFx trail counter devices were installed throughout the Corridor in 2022 to quantify trail use throughout the year. From March to November of 2022, the counters showed an average of 106 users per day across all eight locations! Snapshots of data from the infrared trail counter devices can be viewed below:

.07 Iowa Great Places Status Upkeep

Deliverables

- 1. Serve as the Iowa Great Places point of contact and be aware of all programs and opportunities
- 2. Submit annual Iowa Great Places report
- 3. Apply for Iowa Great Places re-designation and coordinate requirements (as needed)

The TRRC Director secured re-designation as an Iowa Great Place in 2022 for a 10-year term The director also attended the 2022 TFI Legislative Showcase, facilitated an Iowa Great Places staff site visit (May 6, 2022), participated in multiple Iowa Great Places webinars, and stayed in close communication with Iowa Great Places staff to ensure good standing with the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs.


.08 Accountability & Sustainability

Deliverables

- 1. Provide verbal and written reports at regularly scheduled TRRC Board meetings
- 2. Identify opportunities to leverage TRRC funds and work with the TRRC Board to develop a strategy to maximize their funding and Corridor impact
- 3. Present a written annual report to TRRC partner entities
- 4. Submit a formal request for funding to be included in each of the TRRC partner entity budgets
- 5. Work with TRRC Board to develop and approve annual contract/task list



The TRRC Director reports regularly to the Board to ensure transparency and to leverage support and resources for projects and programming. These reports are given during monthly Board meetings. Annual reports are given to contributing partners as well, during which time a financial request is made. The Director also works annually with the Board to draft and approve an updated contract/task list through the Northeast Iowa RC&D.



.09 Large Infrastructure Grant Writing

NE IA RC&D will write up to one large infrastructure grant (applications requiring 80 hours or less) per year, as funding needs require, that will further the development of infrastructure related to the TRRC's mission.* \$1,000 will be allocated from TRRC budget for NE IA RC&D's up front grant writing fee.**

*Examples of grants that require 80 hours or less include State Recreational Trail Grants, REAP Grants, and Iowa Great Places Grants.

**If grant is awarded, the TRRC will not be responsible for the balance of the RC&D fee. The applicant entity will be responsible for entering into a contract with NE IA RC&D and fulfilling obligations related to NE IA RC&D charges and fees associated with the grant writing contract.

Motor Mill Inn

The TRRC Board voted to support an Iowa Great Places Grant application for Clayton County Conservation's Motor Mill Inn Revival: Accommodating Travelers Past & Present project.

This project will restore the Inn at the Motor Mill Historic Site. Renovation and rehabilitation will protect the Inn from flooding, return the historic structure to its former glory, provide meeting rooms and overnight accommodations for travelers, and house a small visitor center for historic and cultural education purposes. Great Places grant funding, if awarded, will be used for restoration and rehabilitation.

\$328,086 is being requested with \$380,000 already secured by the Clayton County Conservation Board and the Motor Mill Foundation thanks to secured grants and contributions from various partners.
