Director: The TRRC Director presented highlights from the January 2023 report and invited, along with the City

of Elkader, everyone to attend the Keystone Bridge Re-dedication on May 7th.

Clermont: Still planning for the 175th celebration in July. Speed cameras are in discussion and solutions for safety

at the crosswalk near Casey's General Store and Skip-a-Way are in progress.

Elgin: The City continues to work on demolition at 401 Mill Street and the community is still planning for

Elgin's Homecoming celebration in June.

Elkader: Ladies Day Out is planned for March 9th, the hospital will host its gala March 23rd, and the St. Patrick's

Day parade will take place per usual on the holiday.

Motor Mill: Planning for potential summer projects is in progress. New interpretive panels were recently installed

on the first floor with assistance from Northeast Iowa RC&D staff.

Clayton County: Work on the mechanics bay is in progress. The County continues budget work for the

upcoming year.

Supervisors: Fayette County: Lehman reported on multiple projects and initiatives happening throughout the

County.

CCCB: Multiple events are upcoming: Feb. 9-Iowa Gallavant Sausage Industry presentation, Feb. 17-OWL Prowl, Feb. 17-Winter ID, Feb. 24-Survival Skills @ Pikes Peak during Bald Eagle Days in the

Ports of Discovery (Marquette/McGregor). Pollock reported that Clayton and Fayette County Conservation and ISU Extension offices are hosting the statewide Master Conservationist event in

FCCB: Marlatt has been working to stay in communication with state legislators on various bills/proposals. Slocum reported that he and Marlatt participated in the REAP Congress in January.
