Large Infrastructure Grant:

FY '25 Contract Review and Approval: Hanson presented the draft contract for review and discussion.

Reports:

Director: The TRRC Director presented highlights from the April-May 2024 report.

Clermont: Still planning for the 175th celebration in July. Solar panels near the ball diamond were moved. A new

part time city maintenance worker has been hired. A sewer lining project is being considered.

Elgin: Ash tree removal has been a priority. The Elgin Homecoming Celebration will take place June 27-30.

The Fisheree Frenzy event will take place June 8th. Additional events include Sip, Sample, and Shop

June 14th, Friday Under the Lights June 21st, and Rhythm on the River Fridays. The Farmer's Market

has moved to City Park. Joelle S. is the new Chamber Director. Amy H. is the new Main

Street/Economic Development Director. The Keystore Bridge railing has been installed. The Train

Depot hosted a grand opening on June 1st. Sweet Corn Days will be in July and Art in the Park will be

in August.

Motor Mill: Regular season tours started May 31st. The Inn will be open during the week when Motor Mill interns

are available.

Clayton County: Seal coating is starting on roads. There are multiple road closures for projects.

Fayette County: Lehman reported on multiple projects and initiatives happening throughout the County, including discussion about Opioid settlement funds, discussion of a universal driveway policy

across 6 counties, planning for the October 12th 100th Anniversary Celebration of the Fayette County

Courthouse, and the unincorporation of Randalia.

CCCB: The Osborne Campground project continues. The septic system at Osborne has been replaced.

FCCB: Marlatt reported progress on the Osborne blacktop project and use of dirt for the Great River

Conservation: Road trail bed. FCCB will be installing a pocket pollinator planting at the courthouse. Marlatt

represented Elgin in Washington, D.C. with the American Flood Coalition in May. Iowa Public

Television is filming along the River Bluffs Scenic Byway thanks to partnership with the Byways of

Iowa Foundation (Road Trip Iowa episode to air in Spring of 2025).

Other Business & Public Comments: Slocum reported that there is a mounting biking project being spearheaded in Marquette.
